- Collaborate with each other for Joint degree program, executive courses, special short term Academic Programs, certificate courses, language courses, vocational courses, access of facilities of each other, knowledge exchange etc.
- Collaborate with each other for opening a Research Center/Extension Centre of skill development
 at GIDR to Carryout Academic Research from Social Science Perspective on Issues Related to
 sustainability in Gujarat and Elsewhere.
- 4. Collaborate with each other for research Grant for undertaking collaborative research in include climate change and environment sustainability, renewable energy technologies, green construction and urban planning, rural development, sustainable social development, sustainable industrial development, sustainable agriculture and any mutual interested area.
- 5. Collaborate with each other for the joint projects, conferences, workshops, etc.

- 13. Support each other for collaboration with its partners in advancement of systems development, technology development, innovation, entrepreneurship and action research inissues and areas related to the development of the livelihood, farm livelihood, non-farm livelihood, social development, tribal development, skill development, innovation & entrepreneurship, climate change, rural development, the agriculture, sustainability, waste management, natural farming, financial inclusion and allied sectors and to the holistic approach on sustainable development.

Intellectual Property Rights

All right created by patent as a result of joint activity shall be shared by the Gujarat Institute of Development Research Ahmedabad, Gujarat, India and Dr. Skill Outreach Pvt. Ltd. Gujarat, India. Unless all the parties agree, no party shall individually, and without prior notice and consent of the others file or obtain patent whether in.

Modalities for Cooperation

- For every specific area of cooperation falling under this MoU, both parties will discuss together
 allowing the Parties to agree on technical and financial settings. Such agreements will include a
 detailed work program and a breakdown of costs and will indicate funding modalities. Both parties
 shall take up funded consultancy projects, research activities and any other activities as mentioned
 in the MOU as requested by the any of the party on case-to-case basis.
- The activities associated with the MoU shall be contingent upon the availability of sufficient human and financial resources, and the Parties will jointly devise strategies for seeking resources to meet desired objectives.
- 3. The Parties shall designate representatives that will serve as primary contact for the implementation of this MoU. The primary contacts will manage institutional communications between the Parties. Parties will not change the primary contacts for this communication. If necessary, thematic contacts designated as need arise will manage communication on substantive issues.
- This MOU creates no binding on GIDR and Dr. Skill Outreach Pvt. Ltd to engage into any specific assignment without mutual consent form both sides.
- 5. GIDR and Dr. Skill Outreach Pvt. Ltd agrees to serve the cause of MoU with best intentions. In case of any disagreements between both the organizations, same shall be gracefully resolved using assistance from the apex officers of both organizations and their decisions will final and binding F DEVE to both organizations.





6. If any of the parties disagree to engage with third person/third party, none of the parties will engage that third person/party for the proposed project.

Entry into Force, Renewal and Termination

- This MoU shall enter into force on the date of its last signature and will remain in force for ten
 years.
- 2. This MoU may be amended by mutual written agreement of the Parties. Unless, otherwise, agreed, amendments may apply to any activities, which have not yet been implemented.
- 3. It can be renewed through a further MoU or through an exchange of letters.
- 4. It may be terminated by either Party on one year written notice to the other Party. Such termination shall be without prejudice to a) the orderly completion of any on-going activity and b) any other rights and obligations of the Parties accrued prior to termination.
- 5. This MoU may be executed in separate counter parts by each of the Parties, both such counter parts together constituting but one and the same instrument. Such counter parts may be exchanged by confirmed facsimile transmission or in portable document format by electronic mail.

Disputes

Any disputes between the Parties arising out of this MoU shall be settled amicably through negotiation. Any difference that may not be so settled shall be brought to the attention of the
